**Request for Individual Study Permit**

**Wider Framework/Purpose of Study**

We request permission to photograph the enclosed list of inscriptions at the Epigraphical Museum in June and July 2015. We plan to upload the photographs to the online database of the McGregor squeeze collection belonging to the Department of Classical, Near Eastern, and Religious Studies at the University of British Columbia (Vancouver, Canada). The publicly accessible database is found at:

It is managed by *From Stone to Screen*, the CNERS department-based project in charge of the squeeze digitization, and University of British Columbia Library's Digital Initiatives department.

The new photographs of the stone inscriptions will illustrate the squeezes at the core of the collection: the Athenian Tribute Lists, and select inscriptions we use most frequently for undergraduate instruction. Our squeeze images are unparalleled, high-quality digital images. The addition of the photographs from the Epigraphical Museum will facilitate the use of the database as a comprehensive research and teaching tool for epigraphers, scholars, and students alike.

The squeezes of the Athenian Tribute Lists are of unique importance to the *From Stone to Screen* project and to the history of scholarship more generally, as they are the inscriptions that Professor Malcolm McGregor used to help reconstruct the lists for the seminal volumes of the *Athenian Tribute Lists* with H.T. Wade-Gery and Benjamin Merritt.

**Proposed Work:**

We are requesting to photograph the inscriptions listed below, with a scale, with the intention of uploading the photos to the Digital Initiatives database of the McGregor Squeeze Collection.

**Dates:**

We would like to carry out this work in June and/or July 2015.

**Material:**

The proposed objects for photography include several stones comprising the Athenian Tribute lists, and 4 inscriptions we use in classroom implementation.
